A set of six one-sided removable vinyl wall decals featuring the ADW story, stormwater pollution prevention tips, clean water commitment, and nature photography. Residents can connect with ways to protect water quality in their everyday actions!



Place them in well-visited public, municipal buildings and partner with key public venues for a temporary display!

Six panel sets available in two sizes: Large (21" wide x 50" high) or Small (17" wide x 41" high), measurements are for each panel.

Installation Instructions

Stormwater Education Wall Panels




Each six panel set is available in two sizes:

Large (21" wide x 50" high per panel) or

Small (17" wide x 41" high per panel)

One set has been provided at no charge to each ADW community member upon request. Additional sets may be purchased for cost (\$220 small, \$320 large) plus shipping.

Panels can be carefully removed and re-used approximately 3-4 times. Keep and store the panel backing.



Materials you will need for installing:

Pencil, level, painter's tape, credit card or squeegee.

Instructions:

1. Find a large surface that is smooth, clean, and dry.
2. Measure and lightly mark the desired location of your first panel (we recommend displaying panels at eye level).
3. Position the panel in the desired spot, using removable painter's tape along the top edge to hold it in place.
4. Slowly peel the backing off the panel from the top, using the painter's tape as a hinge.
5. Press and smooth the panel to the wall with your hand and flatten with your squeegee and/or credit card.
6. Repeat steps 2-5 for each panel.
